This is due to an unfortunate mis-interpretation of the rules at the time of the last meeting (29 th Jan) such that that the discussion then could be interpreted by members of the public as being compromised by the involvement of a party that has an interest in the application (close relatives providing representations). Frank excused himself at the start of the discussion and left the meeting room, Chair handed over to Mark Lappin. conducted shows continuing deterioration of the listed building since their last report in 2021. Stated view that economic repair not feasible. Member of public in attendance also noted concern about anti-social behaviour at the site by non-residents.

Chair asked group if any questions.

Agent asked to confirm if any attempts have been made to stabilise the building since being bought in 2020. Confirmed that nothing has been done to the building.

Noted that since last meeting more objections and more public comments in support received for the application.

Chair asks councillors in attendance if its permissible to have a vote on the application in private – confirmed that it is. Chair asks guests if they could leave the meeting for the vote.

Chair proposed a motion for a vote in support of application, agreed by group. Group voted but no majority was achieved for or against the application (3 in favour, 3 against).

Those who voted to reject the application did so on the basis that fair application of policy of listed buildings exists to save endangered Scottish Heritage. Fair application of existing policy requires it apply to all. Those who voted to support the application did so on the basis that, regardless of past procedure, demolition remains the only practical option. All in agreement that the current situation is a result of the failure of the statutory bodies to act in the past as legally required – that is, to protect local heritage buildings and ensure compliance of maintenance and protection.

Backhill/Castle Fraser dangerous camber

No change from last meeting, Cllr Walker will keep pressing the roads department for updates. Permanent resolution will definitely have to involve a mutually acceptable solution for the landowner and Aberdeenshire Council.

Robin confirmed that a group from the village is being set up to run this and thanked the group again for contributing £250 towards the project (remaining balance coming from local sources). Group will be very interested to hear the results in due course.





15	Following up on lan's comments from last meeting regarding issues with the emptying of the bottle banks in Sauchen, Cllr Walker confirmed that the intermittent service has been due to a combination of staff absences and machinery breakdowns. Residents are asked to take home any bottles they cannot deposit inside the bins – leaving them next to the bins is slowing collection times overall, thus also impacting the level of service given. 	Ian noted that he had received an email from Aberdeenshire Council Waste Services stating that the repair of the fence in the recycling centre was the responsibility of Kirkwood Homes. Ian asked Cllr Walker to confirm that this is the case as in the past the CC was told that the land was in the ownership of Stewart Milne (now in insolvency). Confirmation of ownership will also open up a possible path to resolving the lack of maintenance of the landscaping in that area.	Info.

	Noted that planning permission in principle has been given for the proposed housing development next to Midmar Hall (APP/2024/1881) at the Garioch Area Committee meeting on the 25 th Feb. The CC maintains concerns about this proposal, in particular any potential impact it could have on the activities at Midmar Hall.	Info.
15	Monymusk Issues Robin noted that discussion continues regarding the issues with the mobile phone signal availability in the Lords Throat area (only one network available with variable reception versus the three networks proposed in the approved planning permission). Comments received so far suggest that there are no plans to increase network availability via this mast. The CC does not consider this acceptable especially when the new mast was supposed to improve community communication resilience.	Info.
16	Any Other Competent Business (AOCB) Ian noted that the 18 th March meeting of the Garioch Area Committee has a section discussing the introduction of new 20mph zones across all of Aberdeenshire. Ian noted that in the indicative maps therein, there seems to be a mistake with the area round Cluny school whereby they are cancelling the existing speed restrictions (40/20mph zone) but they don't actually show what the new speed limits will be (bar a temporary 20mph zone). Ian also noted the confusing proposed speed limits in Sauchen whereby cars entering the village	Info.

from the A944 (Alford side) go from 60mph, to 30mph then 20mph in a very short distance.

Cllr Walker commented that the discussion and vote at the meeting is to get formal approval from the councillors to start the consultation for the introduction of the new 20mph zones (this being a Scottish Government initiative). Once approved there will be an opportunity for the public to comment on the proposals, including recommendations to remove anomalies like that noted in Sauchen. Cllr Walker also noticed the mistake at Cluny and has already alerted the roads department – they will update the map accordingly with their proposal in the weeks ahead.
